As the child of a German movie producer father who lives in Italy and a beautiful, artistically talented mother who resides in New York, Liliane's life is divided between those two very different worlds. A shy and observant only child with a vivid imagination, Liliane uncovers the stories of family members as diverse as Moses Mendelssohn, Mary Queen of Scots and an early Mexican adventurer, and pieces together their vivid histories, through both World Wars and across continents.









In The Comedians, comedy historian Kliph Nesteroff brings to life a century of American comedy with real-life characters, forgotten stars, mainstream heroes and counterculture iconoclasts. Based on over two hundred original interviews and extensive archival research, this groundbreaking work is an exploration of the way comedians have reflected, shaped, and changed American culture over the last one hundred years.



That Sugar Book by Damon Gameau- Pan MacMillan- 978-1-44729-971-4- TP- \$28.99- Cooking/Health/Healing/Diabetic & Sugar-Free- 256 pp.- January 2016

In the health documentary That Sugar Film , writer and director Damon Gameau undertakes a Supersize Me -style experiment: changing his diet to include 40 teaspoons of sugar a day for 60 days - the average daily sugar intake in Australia - and monitors the effect on his body. But here is the catch - he cannot eat chocolate, sweets, ice cream or cake; the sugar must come from 'healthy' foods.



All the Things We Never Knew: Chasing the Chaos of Mental Illness by Sheila Hamilton- Seal Press- 978-1-58005-584-0- HC- \$32.95- Biography/Personal Memoir- 304 pp.- October 2015

Even as a reporter, Sheila Hamilton missed the signs as her husband David's mental illness unfolded before her. By the time she had pieced together the puzzle, it was too late. Her once brilliant, intense, and passionate partner was dead within six weeks of a diagnosis of bipolar disorder.
