



The elephant has a very long trunk. With it he helps all his friends, but the hippopotamus always mocks him and says: that's not normal! But what is "normal"?





Sproutzilla is big and mean and green - and he's about to ruin Christmas.





His teacher wants him to live the role, and when feathers start sprouting on his chest, Johnny begins to understand his true potential.
